As we reflect and look ahead, we are reminded of the important mission that drives our work, the dedication of our Warriors, and the support of our community, which inspire us to keep moving forward.



DEAR FRIENDS, SUPPORTERS, AND FELLOW PATRIOTS, this year has been one of growth, resilience, and renewed purpose at Warrior Foundation Freedom Station—made possible by your belief in our mission: *to be the leading force in assisting, honoring, and supporting the military men and women who have bravely served our nation.*

2025 was a milestone year with the grand opening of Freedom Station III on January 24, followed by the arrival of our first Warrior residents in April. This new transitional community includes twelve fully furnished cottages, a fitness center, and gathering spaces fostering camaraderie, recovery, and confidence. With Freedom Station III now operational, we proudly provide 29 transitional homes across San Diego, ensuring that ill, injured, and medically retired service members have a safe and supportive environment to heal and rebuild their lives.

Our programs reflect the heart of our mission. Through our “Home for the Holidays” Give-A-Thon, we reunite Warriors with their families. Our Dress for Success initiative empowers transitioning Warriors to

enter the workforce with confidence, while our wellness, outdoor therapy, and adaptive sports programs remain pillars of recovery and connection.

Warrior Foundation Freedom Station demonstrates strong fiscal health with an impressive 85% program expense ratio, ensuring the vast majority of every dollar directly supports our Warriors. As a verified 501(c)(3), we remain committed to transparency, accountability, and trust, earning four stars and 99% on Charity Navigator plus a Platinum transparency on Candid.

These results are proof of lives changed, families reunited, and hope restored. Every donor, volunteer, and partner contributes to this impact. As we look toward the future, we will continue enhancing our mentorship, mental health, and career reintegration programs, providing the tools and community our Warriors need to thrive beyond service.

Guided by our enduring principle, *“we vow to be a hand-up; not a hand-out”*, we will keep empowering recovery, independence, and dignity for those who have borne the cost of freedom.

WHERE DID IT ALL BEGIN...

WARRIOR FOUNDATION FREEDOM STATION DIDN'T START WITH AN IDEA SO MUCH AS A BELIEF. "WE CAN DO BETTER."

In November 2004, Sandy Lehmkuhler visited an active-duty Naval Hospital and met four Marines who had suffered severe injuries from IED explosions. Each had lost limbs or wore neck halos, yet when Sandy asked what they needed for Christmas, they insisted they were fine. But Sandy, a Navy wife and mom, wasn't convinced. She asked again, more persistently, and learned they needed Norelco Cool-Skin electric razors—essential for amputees who struggled with shaving.

This request marked the beginning of Warrior Foundation Freedom Station. Sandy believed we could do better for our critically ill and injured Warriors, a belief that is the Foundation's mission. With help from KMFB 760 AM (now iHeart Media's 760AM), she raised more than \$68,000, and Norelco provided the razors at cost. This was just the start.

The Foundation has expanded its mission from providing electric razors to buying airline tickets for ill and injured Warriors to travel home for the holidays and arranging for custom-made combat boots for those with prosthetic limbs. In 2011, the first Freedom Station opened in San Diego, offering transitional housing for Warriors preparing to leave the military. Freedom Station II opened in 2020 followed by Freedom Station III in 2025.

TWO THINGS HAVE REMAINED CONSTANT:

- 1) The belief that we can do better for our military members who suffer critical injuries
- 2) Sandy's unwavering dedication

With a background in stage management and corporate work, and the frugality learned as a Navy wife, Sandy focused on helping Warriors transition from military to civilian life, addressing both immediate and long-term needs.

The Freedom Stations were designed to support Warriors caught between two worlds—the military life they are leaving and the civilian world they must now navigate—while dealing with the physical and emotional trauma of their injuries. As Freedom Station III takes shape, the Foundation remains committed to doing better for our ill and injured Warriors.

Andrew, a Kansas City native and Marine Corps veteran, has always been driven to serve. After high school JROTC, he enlisted in 2018, trained as a Network Administrator, and served in Okinawa, Japan, mastering communications across satellite, radio, and internet networks. Following a medical discharge in 2022, Andrew found a new calling at Warrior Foundation as an Emergency Medical Technician. Today, he works as an EMT in Scripps Ranch, continues his training to become a paramedic-firefighter, and serves as a dedicated veteran and peer advocate—living proof of the Warrior Foundation Freedom Station mission in action.

CLARA MARISCAL, U.S. Navy ▶

Clara, a U.S. Navy veteran, joined Freedom Station after being medically retired in August 2023. During her time at Warrior Foundation, she excelled as a student and an engaged member of the community. Clara completed her school requirements and transferred to the University of San Francisco, where she is pursuing a bachelor's degree in biology with a focus on molecular and cellular biology. She is on track to graduate in spring 2027, embodying the resilience, dedication, and hope that define the Warrior Foundation Freedom Station mission.

Ray is a former Boatswains mate third class (BM3) in the U.S. Navy. Having served in the Navy for 4 years, Ray served across the 3rd, 5th, 6th and 7th Fleets before being medically retired in 2024. Majoring in business with a goal of transferring to the University of San Diego, Ray has been a great advocate for fellow veterans, sharing his experience in using VR&E and his education path. DRESS FOR SUCCESS PROVIDES FREE SUITS AND BUSINESS ATTIRE FOR ACTIVE DUTY SERVICE MEMBERS TRANSITIONING TO CIVILIAN LIFE. To spark a successful career launch, Warrior Foundation Freedom Station provides transitioning Warriors with certified expert career advice, résumé writing guidelines and interview tips—along with new suits and business attire for both male and female Warriors—to assist them in their professional endeavors.

Since 2006, Warrior Foundation Freedom Station has provided more than 1,600 Active Duty and Retired Warriors with \$700,000+ in business attire to help them transition into establishing new careers, launching entrepreneurial ventures, or pursue educational programs in their civilian lives. Each Warrior has the opportunity to select business attire, including a combination of suits, shirts, ties, pantsuits, skirts, dresses, and accessories.

We created this program with the goal of arming Warriors with a “Fresh New Uniform” and renewed confidence as they transition into the civilian world. Our Warriors deserve to look and feel their best as they begin this new chapter in their lives.

FREEDOM STATION I, FREEDOM STATION II, AND FREEDOM STATION III, ARE THE FIRST TRANSITIONAL HOUSING RESIDENCES OF THEIR KIND IN THE SAN DIEGO REGION, providing service members with a place to heal and prepare for their next chapter. Move-in ready cottages help Warriors shift from barracks to independent living, and central spaces provide crucial camaraderie during their transition. Qualified professionals offer guidance on new career paths, college enrollment, and more.

All three properties are near Naval Medical Center San Diego, one of the nation's largest military hospitals. Residents pay reduced rent and learn financial responsibility. The success stories of our Warriors have shown that our Freedom Stations provide a strong foundation for a bright future as they enter into civilian life.

Unlike many transitional housing programs, Freedom Station is uniquely structured. It is not a shelter or a temporary fix. It is a thoughtfully designed, community-oriented residential solution. Here, Warriors are surrounded by fellow peers who understand their challenges, as well as a support network that includes mentors, counselors, and staff dedicated to cultivating their success.

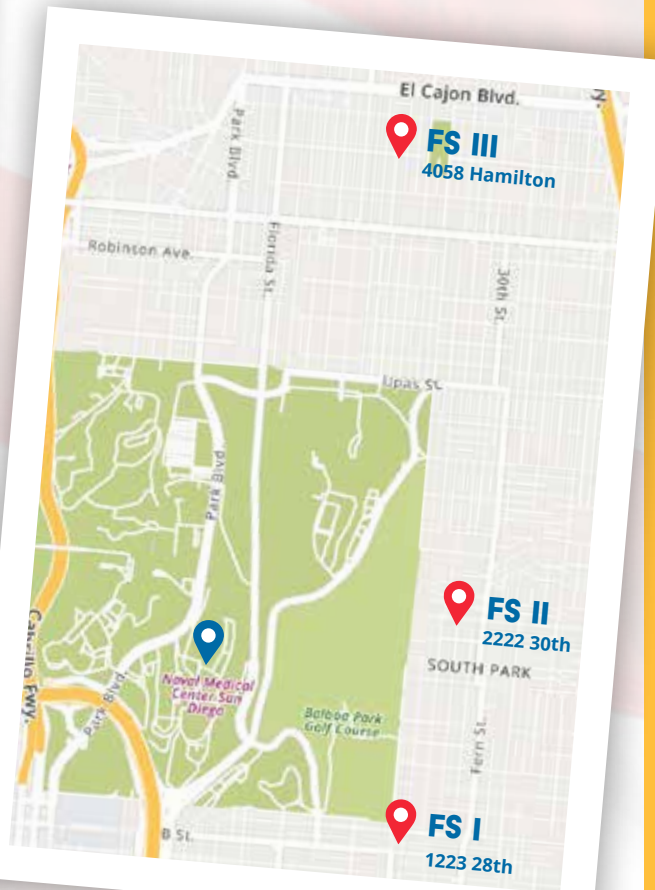

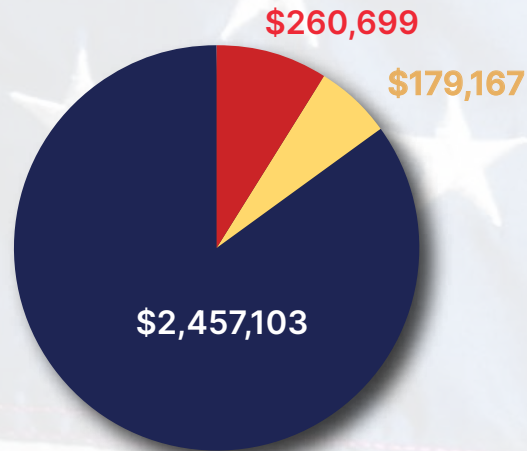

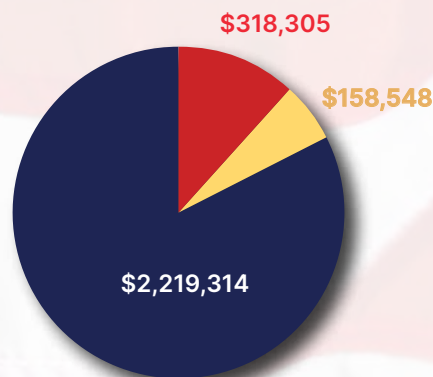

2025



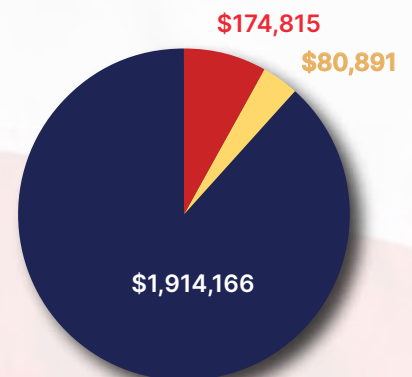
- Management and General (9%)

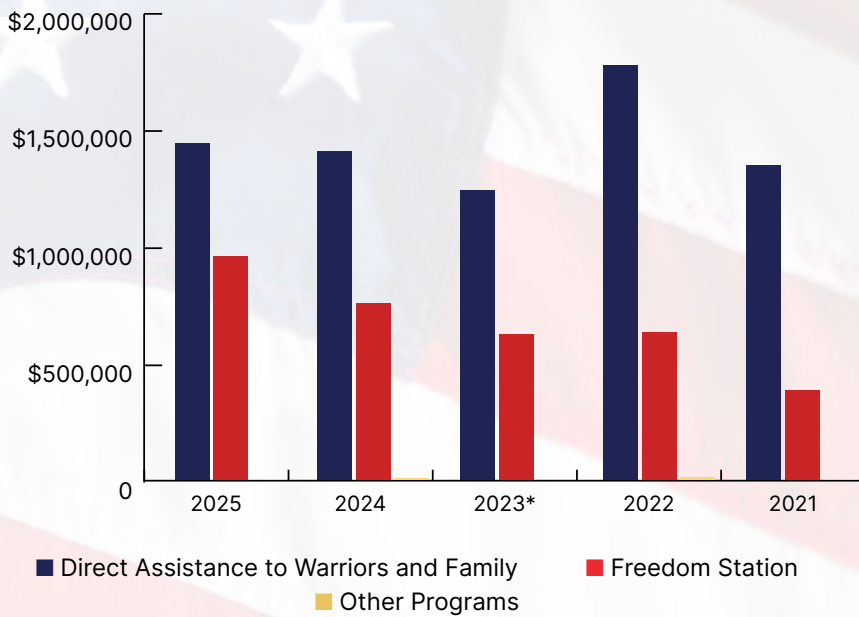
